SSC Holds Anniversary Celebration



Seminole State College celebrated 75 years of service to the community last month with an array of speakers, food, honored guests, long-time friends and college supporters. Approximately 270 guests gathered in SSC's Foundation Hall on Dec. 11, to pay tribute to the institution, which began in the local high school 75 years earlier.

Speakers to celebrate the event included SSC President Dr. Jim Utterback, former SSC Regent Melvin Moran, former SSC President Dr. Jim Cook, and University of Oklahoma President David Boren. Newly-appointed Oklahoma Chancellor for Higher Education Glen Johnson and Oklahoma Lieutenant Governor-elect Jari Askins also provided special comments at the event.

Immediately following the program, a ceremonial ground breaking

ceremony was held for upcoming SSC building and expansion projects.

Construction is currently underway on a 150-bed, suite-style student housing facility. This state-of-the-art residential learning center will be located on the main campus of SSC directly north of the Roesler Residential Learning Center.

A new maintenance facility will be constructed on the far north end of campus. Construction of the new facility includes a metal building, access road and new parking lot.

A wellness/athletic training facility and softball complex will be constructed on college property just south of Highway 9 across from the main campus. The facility will be constructed in compliance with Title IX to provide state-of-the-art fields and facilities for the Lady Trojan Softball Team.

An expansion of Tanner Hall will allow for the development of a Student Success Center and provide a modern one-stop shop for students' academic testing, placement, advising and other essential services. The renovation project will also create much-needed classroom space.

Earlier on the afternoon of Dec. 11, a special luncheon was hosted for former SSC faculty, regents and administrators in the meeting room in the E. T. Dunlap Student Union on the SSC campus. The luncheon was designed to honor individuals who have contributed to the college's success.

Seminole "Junior" College began as the 13th and 14th grades in Seminole High School in 1931. In 1969, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education recommended the development of a state-supported junior college, which would be separate from the local high school. Classes were moved to the First Presbyterian Church in 1969, while an official classroom building was being constructed on the northwest side of town.

The community continued its support for the college by approving a \$250,000 bond issue to finance the new facility and help support the college until 1975, when SJC became a fully state-supported institution. At the time, Seminole was the only community in the state of Oklahoma to ever impose a sales tax on itself for the support of a college.

Now standing on an 82-acre campus, the college is composed of 12 buildings, has an annual fall enrollment of over 2,200 students, employs 125 individuals full-time, and operates on an annual budget of over \$15 million.

SSC Regents Hold December Meeting

The Seminole State College Board of Regents convened for the last time in 2006 on Dec. 14. At the meeting, the SSC Board selected construction management companies for upcoming construction projects and updated SSC policies.

During the President's report to the Board, Dr. Jim Utterback provided a personnel update and presented a list of proposed dates for the 2007 Regents meetings. He also announced that Higher Ed Day at the Capitol will take place Wednesday, Feb. 27, 2007.

SSC psychology instructor Dr. Jacque Stewart will be retiring following the fall semester, and Kendall Rogers has been appointed as a new psychology instructor beginning in the spring semester. In other personnel updates, Veterans Upward Bound adviser Lisa Sylvester submitted her resignation effective Jan. 2, 2007.

The president updated the board on a variety of campus activities, including the ribbon cutting ceremony for the Dan Boren Business Development Center in late October and a campus "Coffee with the President" in late November. Utterback also shared information with the board about recent campus activities included an entry by the Student Government Association in the Seminole Chamber parade.

He also told the board about a luncheon hosted at the Jasmine Moran Children's Museum for the college's in-

ternational students and a concert held on campus by the college's band, "Permanent Issue." Utterback thanked everyone for their support of the college's 75th anniversary celebration and highlighted the "Finals Eve Breakfast," which SSC administrators, faculty and staff served to students late Monday, Dec. 11.

Utterback reminded the board about the upcoming SSC Educational Foundation Holiday Event that will be held Friday, Dec. 15, and provided an update on the current residence hall construction project.

Finally, the president reported that Social Sciences Division Chair Pam Koenig has been named as the committee chair for the SSC Self-Study for the Higher Learning Commission. This is in preparation for the 2009-2010 Continuing Accreditation Self-Study.

During the first two items of business, the board voted to select Manhattan Construction Company to serve as the construction manager for the Wellness/Title IX project and the Student Success/Placement Center and Retention project.

Under the next item of business, the board voted to select Oscar J. Boldt Construction to serve as the construction manager for the Maintenance Building project. Boldt Construction is already on campus overseeing the new residential hall project.

Next, the board approved five items on the agenda dealing with policy revi-

sions. The updated policy areas included presidential duties, contract renewals, employee benefits, tuition and fee reimbursement and purchasing. Several of the revisions changed outdated wording to reflect current practices.

Under the next item of business, the board approved the purchase of \$200,409.61 worth of furniture for the new residential learning center. The bid was awarded to Oklahoma Correctional Industries off of state contract. Given the large amount of furniture needed, it was ordered early to ensure timely delivery.

Next, the board approved the purchase of \$69,686.25 of computer equipment from Gateway to provide new computers for full-time faculty. SSC is planning to have a "wireless campus" by next fall, allowing Internet access from anywhere on the main campus.

For the last item on the agenda, the board voted to renew SSC's annual contract with Suzie Brewster & Associates for consulting services in Washington, D.C. The terms and conditions of the contract remained unchanged from the 2005-2006 agreement.

Board members present at the meeting included: Chair David Wilson, Roger Nansel, Jon Flowers, Bill Huser, Marci Donaho and Jeff Miller.

The SSC Regents' next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, Jan. 25, 2007.

Jim Riley Speaks to Student-Athletes

Riley, who personally suffered from the effects of drugs and alcohol in his own life, shared stories and insights into the challenges and temptations facing young adults.

Riley is the founder of Jim Riley OUTREACH, Inc. He travels the country to speak with teens about the effects of drugs and alcohol. Based in Edmond, Okla., the OUTREACH also provides support groups, counseling, and resources for individuals with substance abuse problems.

Since beginning OUTREACH in 1986, Riley has made more than 1,500 appearances speaking on drug and alcohol-related issues. He has served as a special consultant for the University of Oklahoma since 1989.
