SSC hosted Kids on Campus June 16-19, featuring an art lab, a STEM robotics class, an agriculture course and a cooking course.

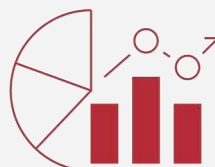
SSC AT A GLANCE



Established in 1931 as Seminole Junior College.



Fall 2025 enrollment: 1,534 head-count, up 4.2% from Fall 2024.



Affordable tuition: \$168 per credit hour for Oklahoma residents, about half the per-credit cost of Oklahoma's public four-year universities (2025–26 rates).



Easy transfer: Built-in pathways to Oklahoma universities, including 2+2 agreements with OSU Agriculture and OU Polytechnic (Cybersecurity).

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

In a year defined by momentum, Seminole State College continued to prove what is possible when people gather with purpose. Every day on our campus, students arrive with goals to pursue and responsibilities to balance. In 2025, they met those challenges with grit, curiosity, and determination, and our faculty and staff matched that effort with steady support and high expectations.

This year, SSC strengthened the services that help students persist and thrive. We launched TimelyCare, a virtual health and well being platform that gives SSC students 24/7 access to care at no cost and without traditional insurance barriers. We also expanded local access through a new partnership with The Clinic, helping make affordable preventive and primary health-care easier to reach for students close to

campus.

We celebrated new opportunities that build pride and connection as well. Alongside the launch of our esports program, we also launched cross country. In the fall of 2026, we will launch our new paralegal program, creating new pathways for students to compete, grow, and represent SSC at a high level.

Partnership remained a hallmark of our work. We continued strengthening relationships that support workforce development, student success, and community well being.

Then, in December, SSC reached a historic milestone. We received a \$17 million unrestricted gift from philanthropist MacKenzie Scott through Yield Giving, the largest single donation in our 94 year history. Stewarded by the Seminole State

College Educational Foundation, this transformational investment will expand scholarships, strengthen student success initiatives, reward employee performance, and accelerate priorities outlined in our strategic plan.

To our students, thank you for inspiring us. To our faculty and staff, thank you for the daily work that makes this College a place of belonging and possibility. To our Board of Regents, thank you for your leadership and trust. And to our community supporters and partners, thank you for standing with SSC as we build the future together.

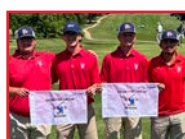
Regents Appointed

1. SSC Receives Historic \$17 Million Gift From MacKenzie Scott's Yield Giving

Seminole State College received a \$17 million unrestricted gift from philanthropist MacKenzie Scott through Yield Giving, the largest single donation in the college's 94-year history.

2. SSC Launches Esports Program

SSC announced a new esports program beginning in Fall 2025, combining competitive gaming with academic coursework tied to career pathways in esports and digital media.

3. SSC Expands Social Sciences Division, Aims to Offer Paralegal Program

SSC expanded its Social Sciences Division, strengthening instruction while positioning the college to launch a new Associate in Applied Science in Paralegal Studies. SSC plans to begin the program in August 2026,

4. SSC Secures Two Federal Grants to Enhance Academic Support

The U.S. Department of Education awarded SSC two federal TRIO Student Support Services grants, including a traditional SSS grant totaling \$1,532,570 and

a STEM SSS grant totaling \$1,361,820 over a five-year period.

5. The Clinic, SSC Partner on Student Health

SSC and The Clinic announced a new partnership to provide comprehensive health care access for SSC students beginning Spring 2026. Students will be able to visit The Clinic's location near campus, expanding access to affordable preventive and primary care.
