Nicholas Costa Undergraduate Scholarship! 🤏

CHADD, Children, and Adults with Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder, an organization that provides education, advocacy, and support for individuals with ADHD and their families, is accepting applications for the Nicholas Costa Undergraduate Scholarship. In honor of Nicholas Costa's outstanding dedication to helping improve the lives of people with ADHD, an undergraduate scholarship program was created to assist students with ADHD in obtaining a degree from a two-year or four-year college. The award will help to cover tuition expenses for the upcoming spring 2023 semester. Through the Scholarship Program,

disABLEDperson, Inc. National Scholarship for College Students with Disabilities!

In order to qualify for the **disABLEDperson Scholarship**, the student must be enrolled in a two or four-year accredited college or university in the United States of America. They must be a matriculated student and attend school full-time and a U. S. citizen. Part-time status is acceptable if the part-time attendance is due to their disability and not their financial situation (minimum of 6 credits for undergraduate, 6 credits for graduate). This is not available to high school students. For more information or to apply, please visit the scholarship provider's website. <u>The deadline for application is March 31, 2023</u>. 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NASNTI Assistive Technology Device Loaner Program

One of the main objectives of the NASNTI grant program is to focus on helping students in the classroom. For starters, NASNTI has established an Access Lab on campus to provide flexible access to computers equipped with assistive devices and software for students who identify with a disability. NASNTI has also started a loaner device program for students with disabilities. How to Take Care of Your Device

<u>Do not</u> leave assistive technology devices unattended.

<u>Do not</u> leave assistive technology devices in cars.

Do not leave assistive technology devices in plain view in homes or leave them in an unlocked home or garage.

Do leave assistive technology devices in locked cabinets or locked offices within school buildings.

Do keep assistive technology device information password-protected (if applicable).

<u>Protect</u> from liquids or dampness and extreme temperatures (i.e., do not leave in a truck or car for long periods of time.

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
