Concurrent / Dual enrollment - Summer of 2022?

Our current sophomore and juniors who have taken the Pre-ACT or ACT and have scored a 19 or higher in a core content subject area are eligible for concurrent and / or dual enrollment this summer. The state of Oklahoma and Seminole State College will pay up to 18 hours of tuition for seniors and 9 hours of tuition for juniors beginning this summer and through 2022-23.

Reiden Walker, a junior at Okemah High School completed 9 hours of college course work last fall and will complete six hours this spring for a total of 15 college credit hours while in high school. To successfully complete college coursework along with high school courses at the same time is quite an example for other students. Equally impressive is that Reiden has recently scored a 35 on the ACT assessment according to Alanna Bradley of the *Okemah News Leader*. Reiden's advice is to learn as much as you can in your courses and practice for the assessments. Calling all Juniors—Last Call for Oklahoma's Promise


Oklahoma's Promise allows eighth-, ninth-, 10th- and 11th-grade students from families with an income of \$60,000 or less to earn a college tuition scholarship. Students must also meet academic and conduct requirements in high school.

To enroll in the Oklahoma's Promise program, the student must be:


- an Oklahoma resident;
- enrolled in the eighth, ninth, 10th or 11th grade in an Oklahoma high school (homeschool students must be age 13, 14, 15 or 16); and.
- a student whose parents earn \$60,000 or less per year.*

If the student meets the program's requirements, Oklahoma's Promise will pay his/her tuition at an Oklahoma public two-year college or four-year university. It will also cover at least a portion of tuition at an Oklahoma accredited private college or university or for certain programs that meet the requirements to be eligible for federal student financial aid offered at Oklahoma public technology centers. The scholarship amount, however, does not cover items such as fees, books, supplies, or room and board. Some institutions offer additional aid to Oklahoma's Promise students; please check with the institution you plan to attend to determine if additional funds may be available to you.
