#### **Other Data Indicating Quality Relevant to Degree Program Major Field**

Student Feedback on Instruction: The Child Development feedback responses ranged from a 4 to a 5, which is “usually applies” and “almost always replies” with a 4.2 rating overall. The overall rating for the technology portion relating to online courses was 4.1.

Graduate Exit Survey: No relevant current data available.

Collegiate Assessment of Academic Proficiency (CAAP) Test: Although the overall Writing and Reading scale components of the CAAP test show slightly lower averages than the national scale, they are still both just 0.2 below the average which still falls within the Short Term Thresholds established by SSC back in 2007. To aid in the areas of writing and reading, the Child Development instructors will continue to incorporate outside reading and research activities while encouraging mastery of necessary writing skills.

Community College Survey of Student Engagement: The survey showed the greatest success in the area of Student-Faculty Interaction with SSC at 54.2 which was only 4.1 difference with Top Performing colleges nationally and well above other cohort colleges. In this regards CD instructors offer a wide array of course options, but many of the offerings are online. The results from the survey maintain that our faculty continue to foster communication with their students through the use of Cruiser as well as in person.
